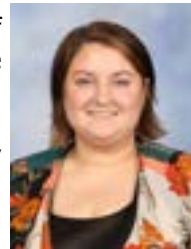

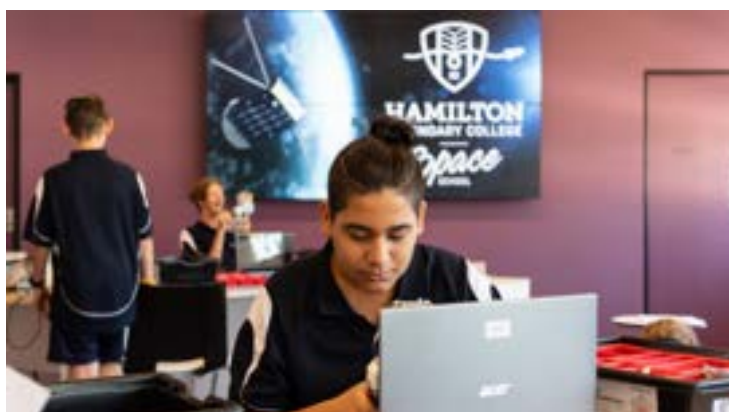
STEM

Our STEM classes this year are off to a flying start – especially in Year 9 where students have been investigating how Newton's Laws of Motion apply to rocketry. Students have been applying the principles they are learning to create effective rocket designs.

In Year 8, students are exploring accuracy and precision in robotic movement, trying to understand why, often, a robot will not behave exactly as intended. Students are exploring what variables can be tweaked so that the robot will behave as expected. Students are also exploring the power of gear configurations to simplify machines and keep them moving.

Our Year 10 STEM lessons are very topical, with students applying their knowledge of Science, Maths and Computer Science to model the spread of viruses among humans. Students have gained an appreciation of the random outcomes that occur among a given population by calculating percentages and observing the effect of chance and probability. Students are using this information to determine a vaccination strategy that minimises the number of people affected by a disease. Students have had several interesting discussions around the COVID-19 pandemic, and the modelling exercises have helped visualise how governments and health agencies are managing the pandemic situation.

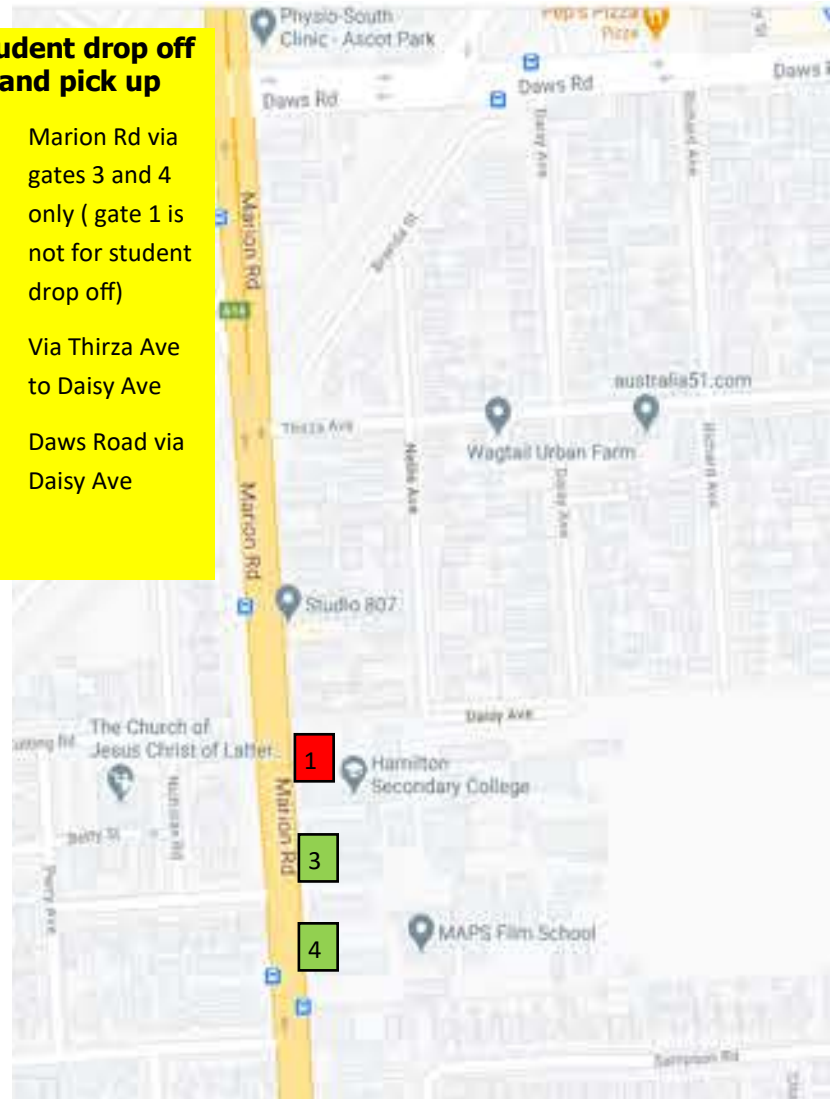
